Addiction Recovery Speaker, MTV Personality, Best-selling author






Novak in Pop Culture

Born in Baltimore, Maryland, Brandon Novak is a skateboarder from the renowned Powell-Peralta team, an MTV celebrity (Viva La Bam, Bam's Unholy Union), an alumnus of the Jackass motion picture series, a star of the legendary CKY skateboard video series, and author of his best-selling addiction memoir Dreamseller. He has made several appearances on The Howard Stern Show (in which he received recognition for one of Stern's Top Ten Outrageous Moments.) Novak was also a guest host to Bam Margera on Sirius XM's Radio Bam, and guest host on the TBS series Bam's Badass Game Show.






Novak travels the country as an addiction/recovery public speaker, in an effort to raise awareness and help addicts find the treatment they need. 



Novak's gritty memoir offers no cliché-ending of "an addict who got out before it was too late". The book has been praised for its honesty. It is the story of an anti-hero whose lust for heroin caused him to throw away his lifelong dream of being a pro skater for a needle. Novak's dark depiction of his addiction is craftily balanced with insightful humor and humanistic observations. Dreamseller inspires addicts to seek the help they so desperately need. "It's never too late to change your life," Novak says, "Your history doesn't have to dictate your future, and as long as you're breathing it's never too late." The book provides insight to addicts' families and loved ones and serves as a cautionary tale for our youth.

Brandon's second book. The Brandon Novak Chronicles, the first-ever. graphic addiction novel is a compilation Brandon's stories which take the reader from the gritty streets of Baltimore dope dens to his behind thescenes adventures with Bam Margera and the CKY Crew.

His latest book, The Streets of Baltimore, was released in 2020 and contains never before see photos and other stories of where Brandon grew up.



EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH **BRANDON NOVAK**

Every hard-core addict has doubts if they'll ever get clean. Particularly if they've always relapsed!

Chatter in your mind that no one believes you can. We reassure each other, we say "It's not true! We believe in you! It's just chatter. Don't listen!"

But what if, what if it wasn't just chatter? What if it was true? What if everyone who really, really knew you, your friends, your family, people you spent time with all thought "there is just no way that quy will ever make it?" No one thought you'd ever stop. They even had bets about how long it would be until you were loaded again, ... just like all the other times. This is the story of the guy no one ever thought could ever make it. A hopeless case. This is the story of Brandon Novak.

Brandon Novak was a skateboarding phenom. As a kid, he put the skateboarding world on notice.

As a 14 year old, Brandon was living the dream of every other skateboarding kid in the world; the first skateboarder ever



endorsed by Gatorade. A year later, at 15, traveling around the world. doing demos with Tony Hawk, Mike Vallely, Bucky Lasek, etc. and even designing his own Pro Model skateboard for Powell Peralta.

By the age of 23, tens of millions of people knew his name as he starred in MTV's hit reality TV show, Viva La Bam and the Jackass movies. By his late twenties,

he'd written and published an autobiography addiction memoir, titled Dreamseller, which became a New York Times bestseller.

His stratospheric ride of fame, fortune, media and sponsorships also carried with it, the ever-more demanding mistress of addiction and somewhere along this ride, she took control and robbed Brandon of all his possessions, his self worth and everything near and dear his heart. She took it all.

If you looked at his list of accomplishments on paper, he'd appear to be the guy with the golden touch, a charmed life, an exceedingly successful man with all the trappings the rest of us would call success. Reality was very different. Brandon found himself a 35-year-old homeless man whose sum total of worldly possessions consisted of eight scarves, two jackets, three socks, one stick of deodorant, and four cigarette butts in his pocket that he had dug out of a receptacle, all of which fit into a bag which doubled as his pillow.

In and out of 13 in-patient treatment centers and a blur of



countless detoxes and outpatients Nothing worked. His own mother bought him a burial plot, people took life insurance policies out on him, and he was on life support for 7 days. His mother depleted several savings accounts and sold a total of four homes in desperation to repeatedly get Brandon into treatment and the help to save his life. At one particularly hopeless moment, exhausted of ideas, options and resources to help her son as he recklessly marched toward his own certain death, she prayed to God, "God please cure him, kill him or kill me because I can't take it any longer."

Recovering addicts talk of "bottoms". Brandon was a star. Movies, television, radio, business, looks, charm, humor, a best-selling book about his life, and millions of adoring fans, to a low, he says was ... "so low, the curb looked like a skyscraper."

He was even "horrible at suicide because he kept fucking waking up." It was then and only then, an epiphany, and in this moment of clarity, two thoughts captured his mind. The only things he knew was

.. "he really didn't know" and "his very best thinking had gotten him into this position." Trusting these thoughts, finally he was ready to listen, ready to really trust, ready to focus and recommit, ready for the required hard work and finally, ready to follow the path of sobriety.

Today, Brandon is nearing three years of continuous sobriety and he has devoted his life to helping addicts and alcoholics who, like him, were deemed unfixable, the people no one thinks can ever get clean. He has three more books coming out, as well as the first ever addiction, graphic novel, titled "The Brandon Novak Chronicles," as well as a documentary which will be going to both the Sundance and the Con Film Festivals titled. "Where is my needle?" He is also a national business developer for Banvan Treatment Center. According to Brandon, "Addiction is not a death sentence; your history does not have to dictate your future; and as long as you're breathing, it's never too late."

Brandon came to the Recovery Today Magazine studios and was interviewed by his good friend, fellow addict in recovery and sobrietyevangelist, Colin"Scummy' Morrison. This interview is as real as it gets. There is hope even for those we say are hopeless. Colin and Brandon are proof.
